WHEREAS, « BeADonor » Month support organ and tissue donor registration; and

WHEREAS, over 1,500 people in Ontario are on the waitlist and every three days someone dies waiting for a live-saving organ transplant; and

WHEREAS, in 2017, 347 deceased and 263 living donors saved the lives of 1,269 people through transplant, and 2,141 tissue donors enhanced the lives of thousands more through the gift of eyes, bone, skin or heart valves; and

WHEREAS, research shows the majority of Ontarians support organ and tissue donation yet just 32% of eligible Ontarians have registered their consent to donate; and

WHEREAS, families almost always consent to donation *when there is evidence a loved one* registered their decision to donate, but in the absence of a registered donation decision, families consent only half of the time; and

WHEREAS, everyone is a potential organ and tissue donor, regardless of age; one organ donor can save up to eight lives and enhance the lives of up to 75 more through the gift of tissue; and

NOW THEREFORE, I encourage all residents to learn more about organ and tissue donation and transplantation, and consider pledging their support to **« BeADonor » Month** by registering as a donor at **www.BeADonor.ca**

UPDATE - SPRING CLEAN UP

At the March 6th meeting, Council recommended to cancel the curbside Spring Clean-Up week in the municipality.

In light of this decision, Council further recommended that the Sturgeon Falls municipal landfill be opened to the public FREE OF CHARGE (no tipping fees) for a 2 week period. This extended site opening will allow residents more flexibility in getting their refuse to the dump at no charge.

The Sturgeon Falls landfill will be open as follows:

- Saturday, MAY 5th ... FREE regular 1st Saturday of the month
- Tuesday, MAY 22nd to Saturday, MAY 26th ... FREE during regular hours of operation
- Monday, MAY 28th to Saturday, JUNE 2nd ... FREE during regular hours of operation

Despite numerous explanations and reports over the past several years, questions continue to be asked by certain residents. The following Q & A hopefully addresses most questions.

WHAT IS THE MINNEHAHA BAY PROJECT?

The Minnehaha Bay project is a major component of a community improvement plan that was developed and presented to community stakeholders after the closure of the Weyerhaeuser plant. An economic development committee was formed comprised of leaders in the community to assist in the economic recovery as a result of the loss of our major employer.

Minnehaha Bay has evolved from its original inception to be BOTH a community asset as well as a tourism attraction. This evolution including the change to a multi-use facility was conceived with the volunteers at the West Nipissing Economic Development Authority. Prior to this development, Minnehaha Bay was a disgrace with dilapidated docks and a shed. It was not being used. The facility now comprises news docks, a boardwalk, walking path, an amphitheatre, a splash park and a multi-use facility which is home to Twigg's, Le Loup and our Marina operations.

HOW WERE DECISIONS MADE LEADING TO THE PRESENT OPERATION?

The original conception and construction was spearheaded by the Economic Development Authority. ALL initial planning discussions and decisions were made by this group of volunteers and ratified at Council. Once the construction was complete and ready for operation, Council became directly involved in the decision making. This includes this present Council as well as the preceding Council.

WHAT DID THE TOTAL PROJECT COST AND WHO PAID FOR IT?

The total project cost was \$8.9 million dollars over approximately 5 years. The municipal share was \$1.3 million, the contractor made a contribution of \$755,000 (a monetary contribution) with the remainder funded by the provincial and federal governments.

WHY A PRIVATE CONTRIBUTION?

During the planning phase of the project the Economic Development Authority received a proposal from a Sudbury firm proposing a "design, build, operate" solution for the site. The Economic Development Committee found this to be an attractive option but felt that this option should be available to other parties. A public process was conducted and the successful proposal was from Sturgeon Brush, a local company.

DID THE MUNICIPALITY BUY A HOUSE?

No. The contractor did. The contractor felt it necessary for the project to proceed since the construction of the facility would not proceed due to poor soil stabilization. The Municipality never authorized this purchased initially nor did it authorize the purchase after the fact. The project has been audited by both levels of government who have contributed the major portion of funding. It was also audited during our annual municipal audit process conducted with an independent firm (Collins Barrow). This would be public information if the Municipality had been involved.

WHY THE CHANGE TO A MUNICIPAL OPERATION?

During the final stages of construction, the private company went through a restructuring and the company no longer felt that they could make the project a success such as it is today. The Municipality released them of their obligation and continued on its own to secure tenants willing to locate at the site. This was necessary to ensure the success of the project.

DID TWIGGS AND LE LOUP GET A "SWEET HEART" DEAL?

No. It is important to understand that this location was untested as a potentially successful location. Municipal staff approached many possible tenants in the restaurant business as well as retail/outdoor providers. Many showed interest however they were unwilling to risk a venture at a yet unproven site. We were finally able to have fruitful discussions with the owner of Twigg's and agreed to a lease that would allow them to be successful. The key to the Minnehaha Bay projects success was the success of its partners.

WHAT DOES IS COST THE TAX PAYERS TO MAINTAIN THIS BUILDING?

Given last year's numbers, it costs \$130,000 to maintain this building. This number takes into consideration the operation of existing partners and the Marina. Without the operations located at the facility, it would cost approximately \$45,000 to operate. The remaining deficit is approximately \$20,000 from rents and \$65,000 from the Marina operation.

WHY THE SHORTFALL?

It is a new venture. The site was viewed as a tourist destination and a community asset. It was and still is important to ensure that this project is maximized to the benefit of all. When entering lease agreements, we did so with the understanding that the first years would be a start-up. We now have better data and can have a fruitful discussion with our tenants without compromising our mutual success. We continue to tweak the Marina operations to get closer to a break even while ensuring that the facility is fully utilized. This operation employs 9 seasonal employees, most of whom appreciate the opportunity to assist with their tuition expenses. Last year's inclement weather also reduced some of our day rentals at the site. It is important to point out that all municipalities provide services that enhance the quality of life for its residents. All of our facilities to do not break even as they were never intended to do so. Museums, arenas, parks all contribute to the over-all quality of life. They all run deficits. It is estimated that the Minnehaha Bay site sees over 45,000 visits per year. A fair portion are from guests from out of town. It is among the most visited facilities in West Nipissing.
