INSTRUCTION TO BIDDERS**

BID SUBMISSION

- 1.0)** Bid documents must be returned in a sealed envelope clearly marked “Front Street Rehabilitation” complete with bidder’s Company name and Bid reference number to the Municipality of West Nipissing town hall, 101-225 Holditch Street, Sturgeon Falls, Ontario P2B 1T1, before 11:00 am(local time) on March 26th 2026 (the “Official Closing Time”).
- 1.1)** Bids will be deemed to have been received when a Municipality representative has stamped the envelope with the time and date of receipt with the time clock located at the Services counter. The time clock located at the services counter is the official time piece. Bids may also be submitted through the exterior drop box at Town Hall, 225 Holditch Street, Sturgeon Falls. Bids submitted through the exterior drop box will be recorded as received when the drop box is opened the following morning.
- 1.1)** Bids submitted by facsimile or electronically will not be considered.
- 1.2)** All pages contained in the tender documents form an integral part of this tender.
- 1.3)** The lowest or any bid will not necessarily be accepted. The owner may decide, at its sole discretion, that no tender submitted will be accepted and no contract will be awarded pursuant to this bid process. If the owner elects to reject all bids, all bidders will be notified and the owner will not be liable to any bidder in preparing the bid, damages, loss of anticipated profit in connection with the work, or any matter whatsoever.
- 1.4)** Bidders are advised that the Municipality functions through its Policy No. 2006-332 “Validity of Tenders” and by its By-Law No 2016-89 (including the most current amendments), “By-law to Establish Purchasing Policies and Procedures for the Municipality of West Nipissing” (Purchasing By-Law).
- 1.5)** Bidders are required to check the Municipality of West Nipissing website for addenda issued before the closing date and time. If the contract administrator determines that an amendment is required to the tender documents, the contract administrator will prepare an addenda and post it to the Municipality of West Nipissing website.
- 1.6)** Partial or incomplete bids will not be considered.
- 1.7)** In case of a corporation that has a corporate seal, the corporate seal shall be affixed to the tender form.

QUESTIONS AND CLARIFICATIONS

- 2.0)** Enquiries, request for explanation, interpretations or clarifications must be submitted by email to Elizabeth Henning (ehenning@westnipissing.ca). Only those inquiries submitted by email will be considered. Emails submitted must include the tender title and tender reference number.
- 2.1)** Enquiries will be received up to 11:30 AM local time on March 23, 2026. Enquiries received after the date and time noted will not receive a response.

BID OPENING

- 3.0)** Bids will be opened immediately after Bid Closing time. Only the names of the Bidders, bid price and the required bid security will be disclosed. Bid opening will be available via live stream on the Municipality's web site.
- 3.1)** Bid received after the official closing time is considered LATE, and will not be accepted and will be returned unopened to the bidder.

ADJUSTMENT OR WITHDRAWAL OF BIDS

- 4.0)** Adjustment by telephone, facsimile or letter for a bid already received will not be considered. A bidder desiring to make adjustment to a bid must withdraw the submission and/or supersede it with another offer.
- 4.1)** Bidders may withdraw its bid at any time prior to closing provided the withdrawal:
- i) is in the form of a letter and,
 - ii) state the name of the bidder and clearly identifies the bid that is being withdrawn and;
 - iii) is signed by the bidder's duly authorized signing officer;

EXAMINATION OF SITE CONDITIONS

- 5.0)** It is the responsibility of the bidder before submitting a tender to carefully examine the site of the proposed work. Bidders shall fully informed themselves as to the existing site conditions and limitations to determine all factors relating to the place of work that may affect the performance of the work, conditions such as weather and availability of labour, the ground, quality and quantity of the material to be encounter, the equipment and facilities needed preliminary to and during the execution of the work, the general local conditions, and all matters which are necessary for the full and proper completion of the work and the conditions under which it will be performed.

**SECTION 1.0
INSTRUCTION TO BIDDERS**

- 5.1)** Any failure to fully investigate the sites of the work or the foregoing conditions shall not relieve the tenderer from his responsibility for estimating properly the difficulty or cost of successfully performing the work. Neither the owner, nor any of his representative or agents, assumes any responsibility for the accuracy of site information indicating in the tender documents and the bidders must evaluate such information relative to the actual conditions at the place of the work.

DOCUMENT DISCREPENCIES AND OMISSION

- 6.0)** Bidders are responsible to review the quote documents and to verify they are complete. If the bidder finds discrepancies or omissions from the drawings, specifications and other documents, the bidder should submit a written request for correction to the contract administrator. Written request for corrections must be received no later than three (3) days prior of tender closing date. Any required correction, addition, deletion or revision to the tender documents will be by written addenda to the tender documents issued by the contract administrator by posting to the Municipality of West Nipissing website.

INSURANCE

- 7.0)** The successful tender shall, within (7) calendar days after receipt of the owner's notice of award, deliver to the owner one (1) copies of certificates attesting to the fact that the required policies of insurance have been obtained by the tenderer.
- 7.1)** Required insurance shall include a policy of General Liability Insurance as well as Automobile Liability Insurance having limits of not less than \$5,000,000 inclusive per occurrence for bodily injury, death, and damage to property.
- 7.2)** The general policy shall include the Municipality of West Nipissing as a Third Party on this policy as an additional insured, but only in respect of and for the duration of this project.

HEALTH & SAFETY

- 1.0) General:** Contractor must comply with the Occupational Health and Safety Act (OHSA), the Regulations for Construction Projects, the Municipality of West Nipissing safety policy and as well as complying with the prescribed requirements legislated in the Regulations for Industrial Establishments.

- 1.1) Competent person:** Contractor is responsible using their training, knowledge and experience to protect the health and safety of their workers and others, reporting to their supervisor the absence of, or defect in any protective equipment or device, and reporting to their supervisor, any circumstances or conditions that may limit their ability to comply with the requirements of the OHSA and the Municipality of West Nipissing Safety policy.

- 1.2) Equipment & tools:** All equipment and tools used by the contractor shall conform to Canadian Standards Association (CSA) or manufacturer specifications. The Municipality of West Nipissing reserves the right to prohibit the use of any equipment and methods or practices that do not conform to acceptable standards. Defective equipment and tools shall be removed from the work site premises immediately.

- 1.3) PPE:** All workers must wear appropriate CSA approved eye protection, hearing protection, CSA approved hard hats, CSA approved foot protection and CSA approved gloves at all time while working on the job site.

- 1.4) WHMIS:** No hazardous material is to be stored or used on work site by the contractor unless the prescribed requirements concerning labelling material safety data sheets (MSDSs) and worker instruction and training are met.

- 1.5) MSDS:** Material safety data sheets for all hazardous products shall be kept on site.

- 1.6) Safety meetings:** Contractor shall conduct site safety meetings with their workers and identify concerns or potential hazards on the job site. Site safety meeting shall be signed by all workers and a copy of the safety meeting shall be made available to the contract administrator upon request.

- 1.7) Proof of training:** The contractor shall submit within five (5) calendar days after the contract award, copies of WHMIS, copies of health and safety awareness, first aid certificate and certificates pertaining to the work being done for all workers working on the job site.

- 1.8) Reporting:** Contractor must report immediately to the contract administrator all workplace incidents, near misses, injuries and illnesses and environmental damages. Contractor shall also report accidents/incidents to the ministry of labour or any other appropriate authority required by legislation.
- 1.9) Supervision:** Contractor shall comply with OHS regulations.
- 1.10) Health & Safety Station:** Contractor shall provide at all time a dedicated station for workers to have access to the contractors H&S manual, the OH&S Pocket book, MSDS sheets, WSIB information, eye wash stations and emergency first aid kit.
- 1.11) WSIB:** Contractor shall provide the Municipality with a current WSIB Clearance Certificate within five (5) days of contract award.

WORKMANSHIP

- 2.0)** Workmanship shall be of the best quality, executed by workers qualified, experienced and thoroughly skilled in the respective duties for which they are employed.
- 2.1)** Decision as to the quality or fitness of workmanship in case of any dispute rests solely with the contract administrator, whose decision is final.
- 2.2)** The contractor shall follow the specification of the Ontario Provincial Standards Specifications for roads and Public Works (OPSS).

WORK WARRANTY AND MATERIAL WARRANTY

- 3.0)** During the warranty period, the contractor agrees to restore defective work to the standard of the quote documents or standard specifications without cost to the Municipality of West Nipissing, including material and labour, for a period of 1 year after acceptance of the work.
- 3.1)** Contractor will be informed of any unsatisfactory performance, as identified by the Manager of Public Works and be given a reasonable opportunity to remedy. Unresolved unsatisfactory performance issues may result in termination of the remainder of the contract.
- 3.2)** The Municipality reserves the right to disqualify a contractor due to the Bidder's past performance on previous contracts awarded, failure to complete awarded work, or termination of previous contracts.

COMPLETION AND FINAL INSPECTION

- 4.0)** When satisfied that the work is complete, the contractor shall make a written request to the Manager of Public Works or designate for an inspection. Within five (5) calendar days of receipt of request, the contract administrator and the contractor shall jointly inspect the work
- 4.1)** Deficiencies, if any, shall be noted, and a list shall be prepared and issues by the Manager of Public Works or designate.
- 4.2)** The contractor shall correct deficiencies as listed at no cost to the Municipality of West Nipissing, and notify the Manager of Public Works or designate for a final deficiency inspection.

CONSTRUCTION SCHEDULE

- 5.0)** Submit within (10) days following approval, a final schedule of construction indicating details of completion of all major items pertaining to the contract.
- 5.1)** Work shall be completed within 30 calendar days of notification by the Municipality of each work task assigned to the Contractor, unless agreed to in writing by the Municipality.

PRODUCT AND MATERIAL QUALITY

- 6.0)** All materials are to conform to OPSS 310 and OPSS 1151 as appropriate or must meet MTO Specifications.
- 6.1)** It is the Contractor's responsibility to ensure that materials meet the required specifications. The Contractor must conduct sampling and testing of his/her material to ensure compliance. The Municipality may occasionally take samples for verification purposes during processing of stockpiles. The Contractor shall bear all costs for such sampling and testing.
- 6.2)** Where materials do not meet specifications, the Contractor will be given seven (7) days to bring them into conformance. Failure to do so may result in termination of this contract and forfeit of the deposit
- 6.3)** If unsuitable material is supplied to any site, the supplier must remove and haul all unsuitable material away at no expense to the Municipality. The rejection of any quantity of material supplied by the Contractor or any violation of this tender and contract agreement shall constitute a breach of contract. Upon such violation, the contract may, at the option of the Municipality, be declared terminated. After normal notification of breach of contract, the tender will be re-awarded to the next suitable bidder.

WORK IN PROGRESS

- 7.0)** The contractor shall adequately protect completed work and/or in progress. Completed work shall be removed if damaged due to failure in providing such protection. Replace or repair damaged work as directed by the contract administrator at no extra cost.

ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION

- 8.0)** Contractor shall be responsible to minimize erosion and sediment runoff resulting from his operations.
- 8.1)** Contractor shall be responsible to supply and install any appropriate sediment control measure to prevent sediment runoff from entering any watercourse within or downstream of the working area.

RESTORATION OF SITE

- 9.0)** The contractor shall be responsible for the condition of the job sites while completing his work.
- 9.1)** Construction site used by the contractor shall be restored to its original conditions after the contractor has completed the work. All affected areas shall be returned to its original conditions including but not limited to: grading, topsoil, grass, pavement, fencing etc....

TEMPORARY SERVICE AND FACILITIES

- 10.0)** **Public safety:** The contractor shall provide, erect and maintain adequate temporary hoarding, barricades, warning signs, and lights where required for the protection of the public at all time.
- 10.1)** **Electrical Service:** Electrical service required for the contract by all trades shall be furnished and paid for by the contractor.
- 10.2)** **Temporary Water Supply:** Water supply required for the performance of the contract by all trades shall be furnished and paid for by the contractor.
- 10.3)** **Temporary Toilets:** Provide toilet accommodation sufficient for all personnel on site.
- 10.4)** **Construction Debris:** Contractor shall provide adequate portable facilities, on a continuous basis, for garbage and construction debris collection and removals for the sub trades.

- 10.5) Temporary facilities:** Temporary facilities, toilets, barricades, storage containers, utilities and other construction of temporary nature shall be included in the contract price and removed from site once work is completed.

SPILL REPORTING

- 11.0)** Spills or discharge of pollutants or contaminants under the control of the contractor shall be immediately reported to the Ministry of Environment.

PRIVATE LAND

- 12.0)** The contractor shall not enter private lands adjacent to the construction working area without the written consent of the contract administrator.

MAINTAIN TRAFFIC AND ACCESS

- 13.0)** All traffic staging shall be done in accordance with book 7. The contractor or his sub-contractor shall not close or obstruct access to the public and shall not place or store material or parked vehicles or equipment on public roads.

PAYMENT

- 14.0)** All Invoices submitted by the contractor must show the project name, the tender reference number and the Contract administrator's name.
- 14.1)** Invoices must include the area of work and description of work i.e. 100m curb front street. Invoices with incomplete information will not be processed.
- 14.2)** Change orders will only be processed if submitted with a change order purchase order signed by the contract administrator.
- 14.3)** Only original copy of invoices will be processed for payment.
- 14.4)** A 10% holdback will be withheld for 45 days. A 5 % holdback will be retained for the warranty period.

HOT MIX ASPHALT

- 1.0) The unit prices shall include mixing, laying and compaction hot mix asphalt in the required thickness and pavement mixtures according to OPSS 310.
- 1.1) The additional unit prices tendered for these items shall include the following:
 - i) Requirements of grinding, saw cutting, preparing, and tack coat as detailed in OPSS 1151.
 - ii) All hand work required to place the asphalt as per OPSS 310.
 - iii) Fine grade shall include grinding, removing, preparing, and saw cutting of existing asphalt being resurfaced.
- 1.2) New asphalt surface shall match existing road grades and alignment per OPSS.
- 1.3) After all Manhole and Catch basin relocations, replacements and repairs have been completed all traffic lanes will be milled to a depth of 50mm. Surface Course price is to include all required saw cutting and milling.
- 1.4) Final surface course asphalt thicknesses stated in the bid shall be 50mm after compaction unless otherwise specified by Manager of Public Works or their designate. Tack coat shall be included in unit price.
- 1.5) Asphalt patches in areas of replaced catch basins and maintenance holes shall match the depth of the existing asphalt found on the surrounding road lane to a maximum depth of 110mm. This item shall include base course, binder course, surface course, Granular 'A' 150mm compacted and Granular B Type II 400mm compacted.
- 1.6) Boulevard Asphalt shall be 60mm.
- 1.7) North side and South side Asphalt Sidewalk shall be 60mm x 2.0m from back of curb approximately 970 m (contract limits). Unit rate shall include all saw cutting, removals fine grade compaction and emulsion to abutting surfaces.
- 1.8) Tack coat is required between all asphalt lifts. Tack Coat is to be included in all unit rates.
- 1.9) Asphalt mixes using recycled materials will not be permitted.
- 1.10) The surface asphalt paving will be completed by September 30, 2026 unless otherwise agreed to by Manager of Public Works or their designate.

**SECTION 4.0
SPECIAL PROVISION**

- 1.11) Milled surface of traffic lanes shall not be left longer than 30 days.
- 1.12) Contractor shall complete sweeping of the binder course asphalt prior to tack coating and paving the surface course asphalt.
- 1.13) All surfaces butting up to the asphalt, such as concrete curb and gutter, manhole lids, catch basin lids, existing asphalt etc. shall be coated with a SS-1 emulsion or approved equal material during paving for binder course asphalt and surface course asphalt (all lifts). Included in all unit rates.

CONCRETE CURB AND GUTTER

- 2.0) This item includes the removals, excavation and disposal as needed for the placement of new concrete curb and gutter and granular as per OPSS. MUNI 252: Construction Specification for Concrete Curb and Gutter Systems, OPSD 600.040: Concrete Barrier Curb with Standard Gutter and OPSD 608.010: Method of Termination for concrete Curb with Gutter (or to match existing).
- 2.1) The contract price for concrete curb and gutter shall include full compensation for all labor equipment and material required for the supply and placement of the new cub and gutter. Where not covered under elsewhere this item will include saw cutting of existing curb, saw cutting of existing asphalt, removal and restoration of existing asphalt, excavation, backfilling, subgrade preparation and compaction, forming, supplying, pouring, finishing and curing concrete and removing forms and surplus material.
- 2.2) Where there is existing curb and gutter, this item shall include the removal of existing and excavation as necessary to install new curb and gutter and granular base (disposal is covered by removal and disposal: miscellaneous items). All curb and gutter shall be located as per existing conditions.
- 2.3) Where there is no existing curb and gutter, this item shall include removals and excavation as necessary to install new curb and gutter and granular base.
- 2.5) Payment shall be per linear meter of concrete curb installed. Payment at the contract unit price shall include all labour, equipment, and materials to compete the work.
- 2.6) Repair of curbs during maintenance period shall include the removal and disposal of damaged curb as required by the Municipality. It shall also include the supply and placement or replacement curb, restoration of asphalt grade behind curb.
- 2.7) No additional payment will be made for hand placement, hand forming or saw cutting of curb or expansion joints. Granular base of curb is to be included in concrete curb and gutter unit price.

2.8) Concrete shall be minimum 40MPa following 28-day testing. Contractor shall provide proof of testing.

CATCHBASINS AND MANHOLES

3.0) All Catch Basin and Manhole specifications shall be verified in the field by contractor prior to obtaining materials.

3.1) Adjustments shall be as per OPSS 408.

3.2) Subdrain connections to be reconnected after Catch Basin Relocation.

3.3) Valve Box top sections shall be adjustable type and included in all asphalt unit prices.

3.4) Payment shall be per Catch Basin or Maintenance Hole. Price will include all work to reinstate asphalt in three lifts with tack coat to finished grade and patch at Catch Basin and Manhole locations.

3.5) Concrete Catch Basins and Maintenance Holes shall be located as per attached specifications.

3.6) Payment at the unit bid price for this item shall be full compensation for all labour, equipment, and material required to do the work.

3.7) Payment will be by each.

TRAFFIC CONTROL AND SIGNAGE

4.0) The Manager of Public Works or his designate must be notified of all lane closures.

4.1) A traffic control plan must be submitted to the Municipality for each phase of work for approval.

4.2) All traffic control signage shall be installed and maintained in accordance with the requirements of Book 7 of the Ontario Traffic Manual

4.3) The contractor shall provide all necessary flag persons, detour signs, warning lights, signs, and barricades necessary to direct and protect pedestrian and vehicular traffic within the project limits, and shall conduct operations to cause the least possible interruption to the travelling public and nearby residents.

4.4) Access to all commercial businesses and residents shall be maintained at all times.

4.5) The Contractor will be responsible for the removal of all signs upon completion of the contract.

WARRANTY

6.0) All work to have a twelve (12) month warranty. Warranty will begin upon project completion of the work assigned that year. Any deficiencies resulting in necessary repairs will be repaired by the contractor with no additional cost to the Municipality. A five percent (5%) maintenance security will be held until such warranty period and or repairs are completed.

6.1) The contract administration will promptly give the contractor written notice of observed defects or deficiencies.

6.2) The Maintenance Holdback is exempt from any interest and only the amount retained will be paid out at the end of warranty period.
